

**Policy Type: Technology Policy**

**Title: Acceptable Use and Electronic Device Use Policy**

**Effective: May 20th, 2026**

**Purpose**

The purpose of this Acceptable Use and Electronic Device Use Policy is to establish general expectations, responsibilities, and procedures for Custom Class Charter School (“Custom Class”) in a manner consistent with applicable law, Utah State Board of Education rule, and the school’s flexible instructional model.

**1. General Policy Statement**

Custom Class adopts this policy to support lawful, safe, effective, and mission-aligned school operations. The Governing Board authorizes school administration to implement this policy through procedures, forms, training, and operational practices that are appropriate for Custom Class’s online, hybrid, community-based, and in-person programs.

This policy is intended to be applied flexibly and reasonably. When operational details are not specifically stated in this policy, school administration may establish procedures consistent with the policy, applicable law, and Board direction.

**2. Acceptable Use**

Students, employees, contractors, volunteers, and authorized users shall use Custom Class technology, networks, accounts, devices, and online systems responsibly, lawfully, and for educational or school-related purposes.

Users shall not use school technology to access, create, transmit, or store unlawful, harassing, threatening, obscene, pornographic, discriminatory, malicious, or otherwise inappropriate material.

**3. Electronic Devices**

Electronic devices may be used for educational purposes when authorized by school personnel and consistent with student learning plans, testing requirements, privacy expectations, and safety. Devices may be restricted during assessments, meetings, classes, activities, or other settings where use would disrupt learning or compromise security.

Custom Class may confiscate or restrict use of devices when there is reasonable concern about disruption, misuse, safety, privacy, academic integrity, or violation of policy.

**4. Notice, Monitoring, and Consequences**

Custom Class may monitor school-owned systems and accounts. Users should have no expectation of privacy in school-owned technology except as provided by law. Violations may result in loss of privileges, disciplinary action, parent notification, or referral to law enforcement when appropriate.

## Administration and Review

School administration may maintain procedures, forms, training materials, agreements, and internal guidance necessary to implement this policy. The Governing Board may review and revise this policy periodically to reflect legal updates, USBE guidance, operational needs, or Board direction.

Nothing in this policy creates a private right of action, contract right, or entitlement beyond that required by applicable law. If any provision conflicts with controlling law, the law shall govern and the remaining provisions shall continue in effect.
